

Online safety and security support for your school

Working together for better online safety and security for schools and kura

Online threats are constantly evolving, so we all need to ensure that safety and cybersecurity awareness are top of mind for ākonga and kaiako, and that our technology, expertise and processes continue to be fit-for-purpose. Fortunately, there is a whole network of organisations that support schools and kura to help them keep ākonga safer online. After all, it's a collective effort.

Available support

There is a range of organisations your school can contact for online safety or cybersecurity-related advice and resources, who are also available to help if you've experienced an online safety incident or been targeted by cyber criminals.

The information below is to help you find the right support as quickly as possible. However, there is no 'wrong door'. Any of the organisations below will be able to point you in the right direction.

Your concern or issue	Where to get help or report these
Phishing, cyber-attacks, ransomware and Distributed Denial of Service (DDoS)	As we proactively monitor school networks, we'll notify you of any discovered vulnerabilities or incidents. We suggest informing your cybersecurity insurance provider, as they can help collect logs and manage any legal notifications.
Email spam and harmful online content	Refer these to Netsafe and the Department of Internal Affairs (DIA) . If your school uses N4L's Email Protection, please contact us.
Any privacy breaches	Report these to the Office of the Privacy Commissioner . Also consider informing your cybersecurity insurance provider, as they can help collect logs and manage legal notifications.
Concerns regarding online safety	Report these to Netsafe . Also check out DIA's <u>Keep It Real</u> , which provides information on a range of online harms such as bullying, grooming and misinformation.
Needing to block access to websites or apps	Check your school's Internet Safety & Security Services recommended settings. N4L can block certain websites and apps with our web filtering service, but not specific content within a website. Schools should also review their Google, Microsoft and YouTube settings to help block specific inappropriate content.
If you think someone is in immediate danger, or a crime has been committed	Reports made to the NCSC and Netsafe can be raised to the police. If you think someone is in immediate danger, or a crime has been committed, call 111 . Call 105 to report crimes that don't require an urgent response.
